Screen Nova Scotia is committed to providing up-to-date information on filming in Nova Scotia, and encourages the acceptance of film workers into the Province for the purposes of employment in the screen industry.

The restrictions currently imposed on the province of Nova Scotia by Dr. Robert Strang, Chief Medical Officer, and N.S. Premier, Iain Rankin, have not changed the way productions operate. Currently, once the production team has a reliable health and safety plan in place, production can happen.

For the film and television industry, this currently means:

- Group gatherings should be limited in accordance with Public Health guidance [HERE](#).
- Canadians travelling from outside of Nova Scotia must self-isolate for 14 days and follow the instruction provided by the Government of Nova Scotia.
- Federally permitted Temporary Foreign Workers who have completed 3 days of isolation at a federally recognized isolation hotel may reduce their quarantine period in Nova Scotia to 11 days.
- Canadians and Temporary Foreign Workers (TFW) entering the province must adhere to a new process – please see the Travel section on our website for more information.
